## JURIED ART SHOW REVIEW

The Seventh Annual Juried Art Show held in September attracted many new artists and was very well received by the public. Jurors Sandra Delbridge, Dean Minor and William Pope judged 104 entries by 43 area artists and 44 of those elite pieces were selected for the exhibit.



A total of \$1550 in prize money was awarded this year. Awards presented at the opening reception included: Best In Show (\$400) to **Bob Jorgensen** *Outta' Gas* (photo on left), First Place Watercolor (\$250) to **Raymond Andreotti**, *Sunset: Boston*, First Place Oil/ Acrylics (\$250) to **Zachary Shiff**,

*Providence Sky*; and First Place Mixed Media (\$250) to **Lisa Freidus**, *View of the City*. Honorable Mention (\$100) was awarded to **Crist Filer** *Catalan Sunset* (Watercolor), **Elizabeth Havens**, *Betty's Haven* (Oil/Acrylics) and **Zachary Shiff** *Charlie (Bird) Parker* (Mixed Media). This year's Viewer's Choice award of \$100 was presented to **Zachary Shiff** at the conclusion of the show when viewer's votes for their favorite piece were collected and compiled.

## SEPTEMBER: FROTA LIVE IN HOPKINTON!

On Saturday, September 25<sup>th</sup>, the CAA hosted a one-of-its-kind family concert event featuring world musician and percussionist **Ricardo Frota**. This concert served as a kick-off for the annual celebration of the CAA hosted Juried Art Show. The new twist on this year's event was the CAA's attempt to include children in the Juried Art Show festivities: A rainforest theme, tied in with Frota's music, was promoted using artwork. Handbooks consisting of facts and trivia on world rainforests were created by CAA president Dora Garabedian and available to all interested children first arriving at the CAA building to see the exhibit before the concert.

Frota began his concert later that afternoon in the high school auditorium by unpacking his varied worldwide instruments and homemade "sound sculptures". He then gave a one-hour, high powered concert of rhythmic percussion music and songs that had the audience singing and some even dancing along. Audience participation was a big part of the show: Frota assigned both children and adults to music-making tasks, shaking rain sticks or beating on frog shaped percussion instruments or pounding on drums from Africa or South America. Frota was also skilled at telling stories about his travels and some of the animals and people he has met along the way. Parents in attendance seemed to enjoy the concert just as much as the children did.

She studied oil painting at the Danforth Museum, Worcester Art, and DeCordova museum schools, life drawing at the New England Realist Art School, and is currently studying privately with Carl Schaad. Dianna is married with three children. She also has a studio in the Holliston Mill Building.
